The M:W: Grand Master vacated the Grand East, it being occupied temporarily by the Deputy Grand Master, and proceeded to the altar and as Grand Representative of the Grand Lodge of Massachusetts near the Grand Lodge of New Brunswick introduced M:W: Bro. Wragg to Grand Lodge and conducted him

to the East where he was accorded grand honors.

Grand Master Wragg thanked Grand Lodge for their reception and paid tribute to the energy of our Grand Master in his Masonic works.

**GRAND MASTER'S ADDRESS**

*Right Worshipful, Very Worshipful and Worshipful  
Brothers of the Grand Lodge of New Brunswick:*

MY DEAR BRETHREN:—

It falls to my lot once again to be privileged to welcome you to this, the Seventy-eighth Annual Communication of the Grand Lodge of New Brunswick, and the very large number of the Brethren who have registered and are in attendance at this Communication is most gratifying to me, and I am sure it bespeaks for itself the enthusiastic reception which Masonry is receiving in this Jurisdiction and I trust that the principles and doctrines taught by this great Fraternity will be of a much greater benefit to us all in the future than it has been in the years gone by.

Since our last Annual Communication the War in Europe has been brought to a satisfactory and victorious conclusion and we offer our praise and thanksgiving to the Supreme Architect of the Universe for His gracious guidance and assistance in bringing this to pass and we sincerely hope and trust that the basis on which the New Europe will be built will definitely follow along the high standards of ideals laid down by Masonic teachings many years ago.

On both of these official visits I was accompanied by the Very Worshipful Grand Secretary, and from the number of Lodges represented at these District Meetings and the amount of enthusiasm shown in the work which was covered, I felt that it was unnecessary to make certain other visits in each of these Districts, which I would have done had not the District Meetings been held. I must, at this particular time, convey to each of the District Deputy Grand Masters holding these meetings, the feeling that the amount of work in making the arrangements

has been well repaid by the good which has resulted from them. To Worshipful Brother Metzler I owe considerable, as this is the second District Meeting which he has held in his District and the amount of good which we, as Grand Lodge Officers, have received from our attendance will be of great benefit for future meetings. To Worshipful Brother Baird I owe a great deal of thanks for the work that he has done and the untiring efforts that he has put forward in his District, particularly in the work necessary in making the arrangements for the formation of Tobique Lodge. His District Meeting, held on July 17th, was an outstanding success. Over eighty-five Past Masters and Officers were registered as attending and the enthusiasm shown in the work, along with the present high standard and calibre of that which the Brethren in this District are now performing, speaks for itself on the success of District Meetings.

As the Festival of Saint John the Baptist fell on Sunday, June 24th, this year, I accepted the kind invitation of the Rector of St. Jude's Church, West Saint John, Very Wor. Rev. E.. R. McCordick, Past Grand Chaplain, to hold Divine Service at 11.00 a.m. Consequently the Grand Lodge, accompanied by the Worshipful Masters and Officers of the six Saint John Lodges, along with a very large number of the Brethren from all over the Province, assembled in the Masonic Hall of Carleton Union Lodge, and in formal procession, marched from the Hall to the Church, which they filled to capacity. All those attending were deeply impressed with the very lovely Order of Service and the splendid address of Past Grand Chaplain McCordick. The Church was filled to capacity with Members of the Fraternity, and I appreciate very

much the opportunity of attending Divine Service at St. Jude's Church, and I thank the Brethren for their attendance on this particular day.

During the three years that I have served as your Grand Master, we have acknowledged on three different occasions by a public procession and Divine Services, the Festival of Saint John the Baptist.

You are all aware that I considered it necessary to convene an Especial Communication of Grand Lodge on June 25th for the principal purpose of receiving the Report of the Committee on Warrants and empowering a Charter to be granted to Tobique Lodge No. 48. With this Charter, I proceeded with a number of the Officers of the Grand Lodge and Past Masters to Plaster Rock and on July 19th we dedicated Tobique Lodge No. 48, and I declared the Officers duly installed until their successors were elected or appointed in their stead. This visitation was one of particular joy and gratification to me as it was the second time, during my term of office, that I have had the privilege of dedicating a Lodge. I can assure Grand Lodge that with the enthusiasm of the Masons in Tobique Lodge, that we may never fear that the high class and standard of Masonry will suffer in this part of the Province.

After our official reception by Worshipful Brother J. T. Petersen, Worshipful Master of Tobique Lodge, I proceeded with the ceremony of dedication, after which the Brethren of Tobique Lodge conferred the Entered Apprentice Degree on a candidate. This Degree was conferred in a very creditable manner and I congratulated the Officers on their good work. The thanks of Grand Lodge is extended to: Worshipful Brother Baird, District Deputy Grand Master; Worshipful Brother Petersen, the Worshipful Master of Tobique Lodge, and Brother George H. Brown, the candidate of the evening, for the particular parts which they played in making this visit an outstanding success.

Outside the Jurisdiction I was privileged to make many visitations to other Lodges and to be officially received as the Grand Master of New Brunswick in

a great number of the Masonic Bodies in both Canada and the United States. Outstanding in my official visits was that of accepting the invitation of the Grand Lodge of Nova Scotia to be present with them at their Annual Communication on June 12th. I was most hospitably received and had the privilege of addressing this Grand Lodge at their luncheon on the "Origin and Science of Freemasonry." I was most agreeably surprised and distinctly honored when I was presented with the Erasmus James Phillips Medal by their Grand Master, the highest honor conferred by this Grand Lodge.

It was with much satisfaction that I paid this visit on behalf of this Grand Lodge and I sincerely trust that Grand Masters in the future will make every possible effort to accept invitations and be present at other Grand Lodge Communications, particularly those in Jurisdictions close to our own. In this manner the Fraternity will greatly benefit and a very much closer relationship in Grand Masonic Bodies will be the result.

To all Grand Lodge Officers, Past Grand Lodge Officers and Past Masters, as well as Masters, Wardens and Officers of various Lodges, I express my most sincere thanks for their splendid co-operation and help in making my visits to the many Lodges so outstanding in the number attending, as it is definitely from these enthusiastic meetings that the spirit of Masonry is being advanced in this Jurisdiction, and without their help and co-operation we could not have made these visits the outstanding success that I feel they have been.

I again must refrain from mentioning any par-

ticular Lodge or Lodges for special recognition in this Report, as they all had certain outstanding qualifications which could be dwelt upon at considerable length.

On all the Visitations which I made this year, I was accompanied by the Very Worshipful Grand Secretary, and I owe a great debt of gratitude to Very Worshipful Brother Magee for the wonderful amount of work that he has done for the Craft during my term of office. The many things that he has brought into prominence which have been of great help and significance, majoring in all of these is the Cypher Ritual, which, through his untiring efforts is now available to the Brethren in this Jurisdiction, and I think we all owe him our thanks for the amount of work and effort that he has put forward as the Grand Secretary of this Grand Jurisdiction.

During my terms of office I have had splendid cooperation from the District Deputy Grand Masters, and I would recommend that Worshipful Brother James G. Scott, District Deputy Grand Master of District No. 2, and Worshipful Brother Alvin R. Metzler, District Deputy Grand Master of District No. 3, who have faithfully served in these offices for four years, have the title of Very Worshipful conferred on them. I would further recommend that Worshipful Brother William J. Bambury, District Deputy Grand Master of District No. 1, and Worshipful Brother Robert L. Algie, District Deputy Grand Master of District No. 7, who have faithfully served in these offices during my terms of office, for the past three years, also have the title Very Worshipful conferred on them for the splendid services they have performed, and I would further recommend to the incoming Grand Master,

if he sees fit, to continue them in office for another year, so that they can be given the opportunity of completing their four years in this capacity. I would very much like to recommend that the same title be conferred on the District Deputy Grand Master of District No. 4, but as he has only served two years in this office, I am sure that the incoming Grand Master will see fit to continue him in office and undoubtedly will recommend, at the expiration of the proper time, that he also receive the title due his office. I thank Worshipful Brother Baird and also Worshipful Brother McLean and Worshipful Brother Blaine Pugh, for their valued assistance as District Deputy Grand Masters.

#### STATISTICS ON MEMBERSHIP

The returns from the various Lodges showed the Membership in our Order as at December 30, 1943, to be 5,311, which was an increase of 151 Members over the previous year.

The total Membership as at December 30, 1944, was 5,702, a total of 392 increase over 1943. With a new Lodge to report for 1945, making a total of forty-four active Lodges in this Jurisdiction, I am sure that the reports will show a very creditable increase for the year 1945. Therefore, it rests with us to take every precaution and make every move advisable to assure ourselves that within the next few years we will not have the decline in Membership as we did in the years following World War I.

Further statistics show that during the year 1943 and 1944, of the 44 Lodges 38 showed substantial increases—three Lodges did not change in the total number of Membership, while two Lodges had a de-

crease of one each and one Lodge a decrease of two.

A more detailed report of these statistics will be shown in the Grand Secretary's Report and in the Proceedings of this Grand Lodge.

Yesterday afternoon and evening we again held what we termed The Grand Master's Conference of District Deputy Grand Masters, Masters, Wardens and other Officers of Subordinate Lodges, at which time three of the Lodges conferred on candidates the Entered Apprentice, Fellow Craft and Master Mason Degrees. I considered it advisable to handle the Conference in this manner owing to the very close attention given during the Conference last year, at which time the work was performed using Masons as candidates, therefore, in conferring the Degrees as we did yesterday, those present, I am sure, were impressed by the seriousness with which the Degrees were conferred and the dignified manner in which each of the Officers carried on the duty they were performing, and it is in this quiet, impressive manner that I believe those entering Freemasonry are most deeply impressed.

I sincerely appreciate the number who deemed it advisable to attend and trust that they have received considerable benefit.

In concluding these few brief topics of my address, I want to sincerely express to you my deep appreciation for your electing me to preside over this Grand Lodge for three successive terms. I have endeavored, to the best of my ability, to faithfully and conscientiously carry out the duties of the office of Grand Master, and my only wish is that I could have held this office during the time when our nation was not at war, but when one could travel to the various parts

of the Province and not be under the strain of overwork and limited time, as I am sure we all have been during the past six years. Also when one could have sufficient time to accept and enjoy the privileges of fraternal visitations with other Grand Jurisdictions.

The joy of serving you as your Grand Master is one which I shall long remember for your willingness to help and assist in making my duties so pleasant and agreeable. The renewing of old acquaintances and the forming of new will, I am sure, help in uniting our Grand Jurisdiction more closely together, and I thank you all for the opportunity of serving you.

To my successor in office, whom you will elect at this Communication, I pledge my support with what knowledge and information I have been able to gain, and I sincerely trust that you will give to him in an untiring manner of your time and assistance whenever he calls on you to do so.

Wishing everything that is good for both you and this Grand Lodge of New Brunswick, I respectfully submit this Report.

William Duncan, members, appointed to submit a report and working basis to the Grand Master to assist the subordinate lodges in rehabilitation of returned soldier members of the Craft submitted such report and has had the attention of the Grand Master.

No questions of any contentious nature have arisen for attention by this Board and harmony prevails among the Craft.

## REPORT OF JURISPRUDENCE COMMITTEE

*To the Grand Lodge of Free and Accepted  
Masons of New Brunswick:*

Your Committee on Jurisprudence having been asked to report on the jurisdiction of the Carleton Union Lodge in West Saint John and the five Lodges in the City of Saint John east of the harbour and also the jurisdiction of Hiram Lodge in the City of Fredericton and Alexandria Lodge in Devon, beg leave to report as follows:—

Under paragraph 3 page 54 of the Constitutions and General Regulations of the Grand Lodge as published in 1943 it is clear that the exclusive jurisdiction of Carleton Union Lodge is that part of the City of Saint John lying on the west side of the harbour and the Parish of Lancaster and the five Lodges on the east side of the harbour have concurrent exclusive jurisdiction in that part of the City of Saint John lying on the east side of the harbour and in the Parish of Simonds and that all six Lodges have concurrent jurisdiction half way in every direction to the nearest Lodge in adjoining territory outside the above.

In reference to Hiram Lodge and Alexandria Lodge, since the amalgamation of Fredericton and Devon into one City the provisions in paragraph 3 page 55 of the Constitutions as published in 1943 would give each of these Lodges concurrent jurisdiction in what was formerly Fredericton and Devon and half way in every direction to the nearest Lodge outside Fredericton and Devon.

I wish to thank you for your continued confidence shown in me in re-appointing me your Deputy for District No. 4 and trust that my report to you will show that I have attempted in a small way to warrant that confidence.

I also appreciate the kind assistance given me by D.D.G.M. W. J. Bambury and Grand Pursuivant Charles Grant.

I feel that District No. 4 has had a very successful year and has shown great progress in every way.

## SYNOPSIS OF RETURNS FROM PRIVATE LODGES

For the Year Ending 27th December, A.D. 1944
