The Benediction.

Jesus said "what is this then that is written? The stone which the builders rejected, the same is become the head of the corner. Whosoever shall fall upon that stone shall be broken." Luke Chapter 20 Verse 17.

I wonder what would be our reaction, if we, like the people of bygone days, heard these words for the first time? I wonder how would we apply them to ourselves? Our churches today stand in the place of the Temple first built to the Glory of God, by King Solomon. They are the visible symbols of God's Presence in the midst of a nation. Into the Temple in all its ornate splendor, as it existed in Jerusalem a young man entered one day. He knew the signs of the times. As He looked around, He saw some people defrauding their fellow countrymen by charging excessive interest for the exchange of their currency into the currency of the temple. Some were there under false pretences. They served God only with their lips, not their hearts. They were not really interested in God, or Religion at all — but they pretended to be, and pretence is always the blackest of sins.

Pretence makes honest men angry, and it made Jesus angry and He spoke out angrily against the commercialization of the sacred. "Don't turn My Father's House into a market place. it is above all else a House of prayer." This same young man, on another day, while preaching in the same temple told His hearers a parable about a vineyard. In it He clearly implied that God had made the world, built it, and put man in possession of it. He explained that God had a claim upon part of the products of the world. Man, however, rejected God's claim, even though He sent Prophet after Prophet to explain His demands. As a last resort He sent His Son. Him, they rejected outright, and finally killed. "Now" asked Jesus, "What do you expect God to do in such circumstances?" The hearers remained mute, and Christ answers His own question. "I'll tell you" He says. "God will destroy those husbandmen who claim the world for their own, and He will give it to other people more deserving, and more worthy of so sacred a trust." This moved the hearers to shout "God forbid that this should be" but Jesus gave no quarter. "What is this then that is written in your scriptures. The stone which the builders rejected, the same is become the head of the corner. Whosoever shall fall on that stone, shall be broken." What those people failed to realize was that every privilege entails a corresponding responsibility. Some of the harshest words ever uttered by the prophets of Israel were directed against people who boasted of the privileges they enjoyed through their election by God, but failed to realize that in reality, their election was an election, not to privilege but to service. The heirs of the Kingdom must give evidence of deep concern for the work of the kingdom as it touches and bears upon, the life of men and women in its totality.

The rejection of Jesus Christ by nations and men contains in it, the germs of their own destruction. Reject this stone — this Jesus — and you have failed to climb the heights. The standards of Christ shall never come down. The price He paid for being the chief corner stone was the Cross, and the price will never be devaluated, it will never fall. He will break us, but we cannot break Him. Just as a person cannot continue to break the 10 Commandments, and get away with it, so we cannot pull down Christ to our level. The commandments break us, and they are doing it in our society today. "Thou shalt not steal. Thou shalt not commit adultery. Thou shalt not bear false witness — gossip untruly about other people — Thou shalt not covet." These are God's commands. But we are living in an age where it is considered clever, to steal; where it is considered smart to pull a "fast one" over even a brother; where it is the accepted thing to covet, to envy other people, their wealth, their position, their rank. It is an era where crime is on the increase, and murder may be committed on our very doorstep. And the result — we are a broken society, no longer safe or stable!

No it is not possible to break God's laws. They break us. We cannot, with impunity, continue to break the commands of Christ. He falls upon us like a stone. He is a stone, against which, whoever rebels, shall be broken. We know this has been so in the past. Christ was a stone of stability to the Jews in their cramped religious beliefs. He was an offense to the Greeks and to the Romans. The danger for us living in this, so-called, Christian era, is that we, too, shall be offended because of Him. "All ye shall be offended because of me." It happened in His lifetime; it happens today. "The stone which the builder's reject." Yes the rejected stone is still the head of the corner.

You know a cornerstone today doesn't really mean very much. It is just a ceremonial building block usually placed ritually on the outward wall of a building to commemorate prededication. Until the development of modern construction, the corner stone was usually at a corner, possibly as the first of the foundation stones, and it was a real support. Today it is not needed for support, nor laid at a corner, nor even in the foundation. Often it is placed ornamentally in the facade, or the foyer, and it really doesn't mean very much.

Now perhaps the symbolism of our present age has distorted our view, as regards the true meaning of our chief corner stone, and consequently the true meaning of a mason. We are not unfamiliar with the idea that each individual can be figuratively compared to a stone set or built into the Temple. As 'living stones' of our generation do we extol the praises of Jesus Christ — our corner stone?

We are speculative builders, but have we been faithful to our duties? Alas, I'm afraid we shall have to confess that we have been apathetical, forgetful and careless, in our duties to God, to our neighbors and to ourselves. We have named the name of Christ, but have been forgetful of His demands. We have worn our Masonic aprons and emblems, but have been very neglectful and forgetful of our obligations. I think it is time that we examined ourselves. It is time we put profession into practice, if we want to be true to God, to our order, and to ourselves. It is time that our light shines brightly. It is time that we revived the idea that there is such a thing as sin — yes; plain old wilful sin. It is time that we brought self-discipline back into style, and who has a greater responsibility than we, the members of the Masonic fraternity. Oh yes we are "offended because of Him". Think. Religion must not interfere with the working of our country — No. It must not come into the realm of Government, or into the Press — well, a little, but not too much! Give the latest news of murders; intrigue and smash and grab raids; placard on the front page, the latest husband of the oft-divorced film star; or the pathetic figure of the call-girl dragged into an international scandal. But the foundation stone on which the whole of our Western culture is built Christ and His religion — Keep that for the foyer the back page, where it will attract little attention. Brethren let us try to get more attention paid in our news media to the decent people everywhere who are trying to do something for the good of others, and the elevation of the world. Surely that is incumbent upon us, as masons, who must practice Temperance, Fortitude, Prudence, Justice and maintain Brotherly Love, Relief and Truth. Oh the best news is not the most popular! Still, however paradoxical it seems, the astounding fact remains, that the world's best-seller, still continues to be the Volume of the Sacred Law which is the Good News about God, for men recognize in it, the whole truth about themselves. Brethren; we, as Masons, regard the Volume of the Sacred Law as the great light in our profession. Let us be true to it. Let us live to it as Brethren. Freemasonry is an order which requires no vindication. Superficial Masons reflect very little credit on the institution, no matter what their rank in life may be — for it is the internal and not the external condition of a man that Masonry regards.

We, Brethren, are waging a tough fight in a trying and critical period of history, and Masonry is not meant to be a soft option, and it never will be! But we are not alone. The great Architect of the Universe offers us His Power by drawing our hearts to Himself. If we see the picture of Him, that is present in the Volume of the Sacred Law, we must do something about it — we are compelled to, morally and spiritually — to seek to translate this revelation into action and reality here and now.

Remember, Brethren, we are all engaged in building. We are assembling for ourselves a character home in which we must abide. Against these Masonic character homes the storms of life will break fiercely and often, but if we build on the truths that are proclaimed in the Volume of the Sacred Law we shall build on the Rock Eternal, and the house will stand.

Let us all build and work according to the plans laid out on God's Trestle Board, with the Chief Corner Stone in the place of Honour, and thus help forward the coming of that day when the Temple of God will stand foursquare to the whole world; where men can talk and not fight; discuss and not dispute angrily; and where each will cherish the viewpoint of a brother.

This has been the way of Masonry through many long centuries, and the way of Masonry is wise.

During my year as your Grand Master I am very happy to report that every Lodge, except one that is not active, has had an official visitation from Grand Lodge. A summary of activities is listed separately at the conclusion of this report.

While attending the Grand Lodge of Quebec on the occasion of their 100th anniversary, June 4th and 5th, 1969, it was my happy privilege, on behalf of the Grand Lodge of New Brunswick, to present them with the Square and Compasses made of woven gold thread on a blue background and suitably framed. This was a beautiful piece of work that had been done for us by Brother B. G. Boutilier who is the present Senior Deacon of The New Brunswick Lodge No. 22. Also at that time I had the pleasure of presenting our Most Worshipful Past Grand Master Arthur E. Coleman with the Rev. John Beardsley Medallion and Centennial Medal.

I was extremely pleased and honoured at the Grand Lodge of Nova Scotia meeting in Sydney on June 13 and 14 by being presented with their Erasmus James Phillips Medallion. This is an honour that is most appreciated and one that I shall cherish.

During my visit to the Grand Lodge of Prince Edward Island on June 27 and 28 it was my pleasant duty to act as installing officer and to install the new Most Worshipful Grand Master and other elected officers of that Grand Jurisdiction for the ensuing year.

On the occasion of my official visit to Victoria Lodge No. 26, Milltown on September 23rd, the Grand Lodge was pleased to join with the Brethren in celebrating the 100th anniversary of that Lodge. As well as commemorating their joining Grand Lodge 100 years ago this also afforded an opportunity to have their new Lodge regalia dedicated by the Very Worshipful Grand Chaplain, Rev. Bro. S. R. Jackson and for a group presentation of 25 year pins.

I should like to commend the D. D. G. M.'s who have held District meetings during the year. These meetings are most important to the subordinate Lodges and I am sure that all who attend feel that much good is accomplished through them. Each D. D. G. M. should be expected to organize and see that at least one of these meetings is held in his District each year.

This year approval was given to the Committee on Masonic Scholarships (M. W. Bro. H. D. Hopkins, M. W. Bro. P. E. Roy and Wor. Bro. R. V. Limerick) for the awarding of four scholarships. The calibre of applicants applying for these awards makes the decision most difficult and the Board is to be commended for the care and attention they have taken in making their selections. It is regrettable that more money could not be provided for this worthy purpose.

The Board of General Purposes continues to encourage support for the Order of DeMolay. The moulding of our youth is always a very worthwhile cause and much more support is needed for this splendid endeavour. To those who are already giving of their time and energy we offer our thanks and our congratulations. May we at this time, on their behalf, solicit the active encouragement and assistance of all the Brethren.

In the Proclamation the Brethren will note several notices of motion regarding changes to the Constitution. In particular I would like to make mention here of the resolution concerning the raising of Grand Lodge fees. For some time now Grand Lodge has been in the position of operating with insufficient revenue to cover expenditures and thus our financial statements have been showing a rather large deficit. When this resolution is presented later in the agenda please be prepared to give it your careful attention and consideration. This is a matter of great importance and of no little concern to the Board of General Purposes who feel that there is no satisfactory alternative to this particular course of action. They strongly urge the adoption of this amendment to the Constitution.

There are so many who have so willingly and cheerfully assisted me on every occasion that time and space simply will not permit my mentioning all of them here. However, I would be remiss if I did not express my deep gratitude for the assistance and support given me by all of the Grand Lodge Officers, the Board of General Purposes, the Grand Secretary R. W. Bro. A. C. Lemmon and his efficient assistant Miss Florence Roberts, the Grand Treasurer R. W. Bro. M. W. Dalton and the Grand Director of Ceremonies Wor. Bro. W. S. Weston who was most faithful in his duties. I would like to add a special word of appreciation for the Deputy Grand Master R. W. Bro. I. Dale Steeves who has so capably discharged the duties and responsibilities of his office. I extend my sincerest thanks for his able, willing and

cheerful assistance on so many occasions, particularly when he acted as my representative in making official visits to Lodges in the Jurisdictions. Between us we have been able to visit officially every active Lodge in the Province at least once during the year.

In my months as your Grand Master — as well as in the years before this honour — I have heard the usual comments and concern regarding our declining membership and other problems. The decline in total membership, lack of attendance at Lodge meetings, and the apathy among many of our Brethren seems to give cause for concern, but these are not reasons to give up! Masonry has had recessions in the past and has always bounced back stronger than before. There is no question in my mind that a majority of our causes for concern would vanish if each one of us as individual Masons would resolve to participate more actively in the affairs of our Mother Lodges, discard our pessimistic views and do a little optimistic, positive thinking and acting for the Craft. Our initiation into Freemasonry teaches us that it is founded on stability, justness, and uprightness of character. We, as Masons and members of society, demonstrate stability by the degree of responsibility with which we accept our tasks of life, our justness and uprightness by the honesty and fairness with which we treat our fellow man, and by the honest appraisal of ourselves. Brethren, each task given us from our initiation, through our stewardship and offices in the Lodge is of importance, and it is the way in which we accept these tasks that make us worthy of being called Masons. Let us each resolve, then, to realize our responsibilities, renew our determination to keep strong this greatest Fraternity on earth, and above all let us exemplify always the true spirit of Brotherhood.

And finally, let us not fail to give thanks for our tender associations through the years as Freemasons, one with the other, in a proud and respected Institution which fosters only the noblest of human ideals in an endless quest for the attainment of a true Brotherhood of Man under the Fatherhood of our God.

Welding the bonds of Brotherhood,

All this our creed, our hope, our plan,
Keeping the faith with God and man.

The supply of the cypher ritual (1965 edition) being near depletion, a reprint was ordered and recently delivered.

The proposed taxation formula as outlined in the "White Paper" by the Finance Minister of the Federal Government has received the attention and concern of your Board and subsequent to correspondence with the other Canadian Grand Lodges, your Board has approved the suggestion of collaborating with a committee representing the several Grand Lodges, who will submit a joint brief and employ counsel on a per capita basis of expense to protect our interests.

The recommendations for amendments of the Constitution and General Regulations have received the approval of the Board and will be submitted to Grand Lodge for consideration.

REPORT OF THE RITUAL COMMITTEE

TO THE MOST WORSHIPFUL THE GRAND MASTER,
OFFICERS AND MEMBERS OF THE GRAND LODGE
OF NEW BRUNSWICK.

The Ritual Committee begs leave to present their report for the year 1969-1970 as follows —

All matters which have been referred to this committee during the past year have been duly considered and we report as follows —

On the subject of an installation ceremony for the Immediate Past Worshipful Master, we find that according to the statutes, this office is not mentioned, neither is it recognized by the Grand Lodge of England, therefore, we do not feel that we should have an installation ceremony for same.

We would, however, suggest a wording to be used without being adopted, which could be along the following lines:

"Worshipful Brother you are now the immediate Past Master of this lodge and it affords me much pleasure to install you with the collar and jewel of the office. Your station is on the right of the Worshipful Master in the east, and in that position you are able to assist the Master whenever it becomes necessary, or as he requests. It is a very responsible office and the Worshipful Master will be enabled to carry on his duties with the confidence of having you in this Station".

(Comment on the way this officer carried on his duties as Worshipful Master, can be made if deemed necessary.)

He will then be directed to his station.

The Ritual Committee has still in consideration the Entered Apprentice degree and would appreciate any suggestion to add to the present ritual to make it more impressive as far as the general attendance of the brethren can be involved.

The ceremony of installation for the Grand Master has been approved and is ready for use. There is, however, a little more work on the ceremonies for the elective officers. However, you will hear this year the wording which is generally thought of and we expect this will be fully adopted at next year's Assembly.

Your committee has had members in attendance at all district meetings and work-shops where requested, and are always willing to give what assistance they can. We believe that each district should have a meeting each year on ritualist work as it not only keeps the ritual standard, but the lodges and the officers get to know each other much better.

It has been suggested that next year the Grand Master might consider having a conference the day before Grand Lodge meets, having in mind that all District Deputies, Masters and Wardens of lodges be in attendance and select 3 lodges to work the 3 degrees in full, these lodges to be trained by the Ritual Committee, in order that both the ritual wording and floor work be shown as near possible as expected in standard form — questions and reasons for the work could be fully explained.

We congratulate the District Deputy Grand Masters who have held Work-shops and district meetings this year, as it most certainly aids in inspiring more and efficient work in the Lodges.

REPORT OF THE GRAND HISTORIAN (1970)

**TO THE MOST WORSHIPFUL THE GRAND MASTER,
OFFICERS AND MEMBERS OF THE GRAND LODGE
OF NEW BRUNSWICK, FREE & ACCEPTED MASONS**

I have the honour to submit my third report as your Grand Historian. Since the Grand Historian is expected to report on assorted activities, I thought I might open with this thought which was taken from a Notice of The Corinthian Lodge #13, Hampton.

"Anyone who stops learning is old, whether this happens at twenty or eighty. Anyone who keeps on learning not only remains young, but becomes more valuable regardless of physical capacity."

The 102nd Annual Communication of our Grand Lodge opened on Friday afternoon, May 9, 1969 and shortly thereafter the members were transported by bus to Fernhill Cemetery for the purpose of unveiling and dedicating a Memorial to our first Grand Master, Most Worshipful Brother Benjamin Lester Peters. The Marble Memorial, (located in the Rose Garden directly alongside the Charles F. Sanford Memorial erected by the Royal Order of Scotland), has a bronze plaque inscribed as follows: "BENJAMIN LESTER PETERS 1827-1894. ERECTED BY M.W. GRAND LODGE OF NEW BRUNSWICK FREE AND ACCEPTED MASONS 1967" and on the stone under a facsimile of the Grand Master's Jewel, "FIRST MOST WORSHIPFUL GRAND MASTER, OCTOBER 1867 - SEPTEMBER 1870". The Lesson was read by the Deputy Grand Master, R. W. Bro. George A. Blakney. A biography of his civil career was given by M. W. P. G. M. Henry D. Hopkins, which was significant in that both he and Grand Master Peters held the office of Common Clerk of the City of Saint John. The Grand Master, M. W. Bro. William J. Summerville, outlined his Masonic career and then unveiled the Memorial. The Prayer of Dedication and the Benediction were offered by the Grand Chaplain, V. Wor. Bro. Rev. David A. Gray. The Grand Master on reconvening Grand Lodge stated this Unveiling and Dedication Service marked the conclusion of our Centennial activities begun in May 1967. He expressed sincere appreciation to R. W. Bro. W. J. Bambury, Chairman of the Peters Memorial Committee, R. W. Bro. Reginald F. Wright and Bros. W. S. Follett, President and Superintendent, respectively, of the Fernhill Cemetery Board.

During the evening the John Beardsley Medal was presented to R. W. Bro. R. H. Danelson, J.G.W. of New Hampshire, and R.W. Bro. H. F. Sipprell, P. D. G. M. and Grand Secretary of Nova Scotia. On Saturday Bro. Dr. W. T. R. Flemington, former President of Mount Allison University and now the Provincial Ombudsman, delivered an inspiring address entitled, "Cathedrals

— Ancient and Modern", which was skilfully interwoven with wisdom and humour. The Credentials Committee reported 268 accredited members of Grand Lodge present, the largest on record, with a total attendance of over 300. Later that afternoon M.W. P.G.M. J. S. Hoyt (for the 24th time but the first using a provisional ritual installed the new Grand Master and his officers.

Two of our Grand Lodge officers were honoured by a Sister Jurisdiction on May 21 1969 when the 175th Anniversary Medallions of the Grand Lodge of Connecticut were presented to R. W. Bros. A. C. Lemmon, Grand Secretary and A. W. Gaskin, Senior Grand Warden by P.D.D.G.M. Sherman Eaton during an official visitation by R. W. Bro. Leon Shedroff, D.D.G.M. to Somerset Lodge #34, A.F. & A.M., Norwich, Connecticut, U.S.A.

In the Municipal Elections held in June M.W. P.G.M. J. S. Hoyt was returned as Mayor of Westfield by acclamation. In Sussex M.W. P.G.M. R. T. Pearson won re-election as Mayor of the Town and this year marks thirty-five years of uninterrupted civic service as a councillor and mayor. In addition he served for over twenty years as secretary of the School Board.

June 27 1969 marked the Institution of Britton Chapter Rose Croix of the Ancient and Accepted Scottish Rite in Moncton. This Chapter perpetuates the name of a prominent Mason and leading surgeon, the late Bro. H. E. Britton, 33°.

Many of our Lodges held Church Parades and Services during the year; in Albert County that of Albert Lodge #34 and Howard Lodge #15 was largely attended on June 22nd. The collection here as elsewhere in the province was donated to the New Brunswick Protestant Orphanage. Members of the Fraternity have been very active in organizing campaigns and serving as canvassers for funds to support this Institution.

Outstanding among the events of the year was the Centennial of Victoria Lodge #26 at Milltown, which took place on the actual date, September 23rd. Two rather unusual occurrences marked the beginnings of this Lodge. In its original Petition the name of the Lodge was given as Union, but was changed by the brethren before the Warrant was issued, to Victoria in honour of their gracious Sovereign and it has remained Victoria ever since. The Brother named as the first Worshipful Master was never installed as such, having been killed in an accident shortly before the date set for his Installation. M. W. Grand Master Murray S. Speight with Grand Lodge visited Victoria Lodge on this occasion, which was featured by the Dedication of new Regalia and the presentation of 25 year pins. A very impressive momento of the Banquet was a facsimile of a six inch ruler inscribed with the "Golden Rule". The Grand Master congratulated Worshipful Master Maxwell Richardson, his Officers, Centennial Committee

and Brethren on the excellent programme in keeping with this great landmark in the life of the Lodge. Much attention was given to the attractive gold coloured monthly notices.

The Scholarship Committee granted four \$500.00 awards to four young people, all children of Masons from various parts of the province; the three young men and one young lady are all attending different universities in the Maritime Provinces.

Hiram Lodge #6 in Fredericton is now in the process of building a new Masonic Hall to replace that which was lost in the Zellers' fire two years ago. It is hoped to have the building reasonably completed and in use by the spring of 1970. In these days of inflated prices, this is indeed an arduous undertaking. We wish them well.

Two visitations, one made by the Grand Master and the other by the Deputy Grand Master, were especially worthy of notice. Grand Master Speight was welcomed to Keith Lodge #23 on November 21 1969 by Worshipful Master Donald Richards, the occasion being Past Masters' Night. During the evening four brethren with a total of 217 years of service were honoured, one being 90 years of age. New Regalia was dedicated by the Grand Master and the Chaplain of the Lodge, V. Wor. Bro. Rev. Garland C. Brooks. The Past Masters under R. W. Bro. E. S. Sherrard, P.D.D.G.M., conferred the Degree in an impressive manner. The senior Past Master of Keith Lodge, Dr. H. S. Thomson acted as Immediate Past Master, he having entered the Craft in 1907 and served as Master of Keith Lodge in 1915. Dr. Thomson was 92, the candidate, Bro. Dixon was 21, an age difference greater than the "three score and ten". The Deputy Grand Master, R. W. Bro. I. Dale Steeves, visited Salisbury Lodge #20 on December 5th 1969 and during the evening presented a 60 year bar to Wor. Bro. Calvin Luther Taylor, the senior member of the Lodge. Wor. Bro. Taylor was initiated on October 2nd 1908 and was raised February 5th 1909 and served as Worshipful Master in 1941. His son, C. Donald Taylor, was Worshipful Master of Salisbury Lodge in 1969 and on this occasion, his grandson, Bro. Brian Taylor was also present. Our distinguished brother has been a member of Salisbury Lodge for more than half of its 112 years since Institution and he lives more than 20 miles from Salisbury by the shortest route; yet his attendance record is one of the best.

Lodge Notices tell us much — several have poems, epigrams or even a sentence or two (such as I quoted at the beginning of this Report); others list birthdays of members, etc. Other anniversaries, deaths of members, historical memos, etc. Needless to say these Notices are of great importance to your Grand Historian and I extend my thanks to our Secretaries for their assistance. Incidentally, some Lodges have Historians — Does yours?

Zion Lodge #21 Sussex on December 27 witnessed M.W. P.G.M. Ralph T. Pearson install his son A. Eldon Pearson as Worshipful Master for 1970, this is the second son to be so installed, his brother George had served in the East in 1957. Many Installations this year were followed by Ladies Nights, a fine innovation. Other Lodges held such occasions at other times, for example, Hibernia Lodge's "Irish Night" held on the Saturday nearest the 17th of March.

Keith Lodge #23 Moncton has had its first Minute Book rebound recently. It covers the period 1853-1884 and bears the number 927, which it held on the English Registry from its Institution in 1853 until 1862. It contains many interesting accounts written in beautiful penmanship and has been placed in one of the display cases in the Lounge of the Moncton Temple. The 117th Anniversary of this Lodge was observed on January 16 1970 and the Grand Historian was invited to speak on the early days of Keith Lodge and the lives of its first members. It was noted that Stephen Binney, the first Worshipful Master, had been the first Mayor of Halifax twelve years earlier. Binney's career has been put into a concise biography and will appear in a future volume of the Dictionary of Canadian Biography, published by the University of Toronto Press. Your Grand Historian is a contributor to this Dictionary.

The March Communication of The New Brunswick Lodge #22 Saint John featured a debate between Zion Lodge #21 Sussex and the host Lodge on the topic: "Resolved that the Masonic Order can be revised or up-dated to meet modern demands without sacrificing too much of its historical significance and proven values." How regrettable it is that we have so few debates or discussions on such timely topics. I should be interested to know the results of this debate.

Once again, as we come to the end of another year, it is my sad duty to record the great loss that we have sustained by the passing of many brethren to the Celestial Lodge Above. Our Grand Master's Report contains the list for Grand Lodge, that of the Grand Secretary for all Lodges in the jurisdiction. From Notices and Press reports I have the following: three Past Grand Masters, each from a different jurisdiction, yet all known in New Brunswick: Dr. Frank C. Thomas, Hibernia # 3, July 23, 1969 (Grand Master 1959-1961); S. Carl Heckbert, P.G.M. Alberta, October 1969 and an Honorary Life Member of Miramichi Lodge #18 Chatham; Dr. Norman T. Avar, P.G.M. Nova Scotia, August 1969; two Past Grand Wardens; R. W. Bro. Leon B. Seely, The Corinthian Lodge #13, Hampton and R. W. Bro. Edward G. Perkins, Hiram Lodge #6, Fredericton, the former in October and the latter in January. Members of the Scottish Rite were shocked to learn of the sudden death of their Sovereign Grand Commander, Ill. Bro. Charles H. Cunningham, 33° on

September 12, following the 95th Annual Session of the Supreme Council. Since I have sustained a double bereavement in January of this year, I know the meaning of personal loss, therefore my words have depth to all who mourn.

Bro. Peter Davidson, Albion Lodge #1 and a stalwart member (until recent years) of Ivanhoe Preceptory #36, Knights Templar, reached his 101st birthday on February 26th, he is presently in the Moncton Hospital Annex, as is M.W. P.G.M. Dr. Arthur S. Robinson, who will be 89 years of age on April 11th.

V. Wor. Bro. Dr. Frank E. Archibald, Past Grand Chaplain and well known to Masons throughout New Brunswick will retire from the active Ministry on April 30 1970 and, at the same time conclude an outstanding Pastorate at St. John's United Church in Moncton of 26½ years. To a beloved Minister and true Mason go the prayers and good wishes of thousands, that the coming years may be to him and his gracious wife, a time of fruitful leisure and deep contentment.

Botsford Chapter #7, Royal Arch Masonry in Moncton will celebrate its Centennial on May 16 1970. Their Charter has survived two fires and their records, thanks to careful Scribes, are in fine condition. A Historical Committee consisting of Excellent Companions Sydney J. Horton, John H. Lingley and John Ramsay are preparing a special brochure to mark this important occasion. We extend our Best Wishes.

The past year has been for me a very difficult one and I am very grateful for the assistance which I have received. In order that Grand Lodge may have sufficient time in which to select my successor, I hereby give notice that I shall conclude my duties in this Office, effective June 1971. The turnover of records can then take place during the summer months when most Lodges are in recess.

November 1st, Attended with the Most Worshipful the Grand Master on his Official Visit to Sunbury Lodge, Fredericton Junction, N. B.

November 12th, Attended Corinthian Lodge, Hampton, on the occasion of their Past Master's Night. R. W. Bro. Chester Craig was in the East with a distinguished staff of Past Masters. The Master Mason Degree was exemplified on one candidate, The Communication was very well attended.

On Sunday, November 16th, District Number 1 Church Parade was held in Hampton, N. B. at which time we had the honour of your presence, with Officers and Members of Grand Lodge. My sincere thanks to the Worshipful Master, W. B. John Morrison and his Officers for their efforts in making this event the success it was, to Bro. the Rev. L. H. I have suggested that more co-operation between the Officers of the Lodge, the Past Masters and the Ritual Committee might remedy this situation, also by visitations between the Lodges with the visiting Lodge performing the Degree Work.

In closing, I wish to assure you Sir, that I will carry on to the best of my ability in the Work of our Beloved Fraternity and I thank you for the privilege of having served under you.

DISTRICT NUMBER TWO

MOST WORSHIPFUL SIR:

This being my first year as D.D.G.M., it has been spent by me in visiting the Lodges in the Eastern part of our Province, as well as the neighboring Lodges in Cumberland County of N. S.

A total of 43 visits were made, and on all occasions, I was accompanied by the Worshipful Master, Past Masters and Brethren of my own Lodge, and we were warmly welcomed by our hosts.

Of the 43 visits made, three were District Deputy meetings, four were official visits of the Most Worshipful The Grand Master, and five were at installations of Lodge Officers for 1970. On August 3rd, 1969, I attended the Masonic Funeral Service for M.W.P.G.M. Dr. Avarde of the Grand Lodge of Nova Scotia.

On October 5, 1969, the Church Parade for Districts 2 and 7 was held in St. Andrew's Presbyterian Church at Moncton, N.B. There were approximately 150 members of the Fraternity in attendance, 17 of whom were Members of Sussex Lodge No. 4.

I also had the pleasure of installing the Officers of Lebanon Lodge No. 28 and my own Lodge, Sussex No. 4. Both of these meetings were held in the afternoon and were very well attended by Members of the Fraternity in the area.

In the year just past, all the Lodges in District No. 2 carried out degree work. As is usual however, the City Lodges received the greater number of Candidates. I am pleased to say that the degree work of all the Lodges is of a high calibre and the Officers in most cases are very capable and enthusiastic.

On Sept 19, 1969, I had the honour of presenting to Rt. Wor. Bro. GILCHRIST DUNN ALLAN of Keith Lodge No. 23, a 50 year Jewel, and it is interesting to note that he received his degrees on the following dates:

Received Entered Apprentice degree on May 23, 1919
Received Fellow Craft degree on June 23, 1919
Received Master Mason degree on July 16, 1919
Worshipful Master in the year 1925, and District Deputy Grand Master for District No. 2 in the year 1933.

NOTICES OF MOTION

The following Notice of Motion was moved by Most Worshipful Past Grand Master H. D. Hopkins, seconded by Most Worshipful Past Grand Master R. T. Pearson, and on the vote being called, was declared adopted.

"To amend 1966 edition of the Constitutions and General Regulations

Page 56 Section 23, is hereby repealed and the following enacted in lieu thereof namely -

23 (a) Any brother whose dues for the current year and all arrears have been paid in full, may apply for and be entitled to a demit from a lodge of which he is a member.

(b) Any brother who is a member of more than one lodge in this jurisdiction and who is suspended, excluded or expelled by any one of the lodges of which he is a member shall forthwith be suspended, excluded or expelled from membership in any other lodge or lodges of which he is a member.

Page 76 under "Regalia" To add the following:

A Master Mason with 50 years cumulative service in a Craft Lodge shall be entitled to a 50 year Certificate and Lapel Button Pin provided by this Grand Lodge on application submitted to the Grand Secretary by the Secretary of a subordinate Lodge and further, that a 60 year Bar and 75 year Bar also be supplied under similar provision when the member is eligible.

Page 76 under Fees "last paragraph"

"To strike out the words and figures "one dollar and fifty cents" (\$1.50) and substitute therefore the words and figures "two dollars (\$2.00)"

PRESENTATIONS

At this period The Most Worshipful Grand Master directed The Grand Director of Ceremonies to conduct Most Worshipful Past Grand Master W. Edward Moseley of the Grand Lodge of Nova Scotia to the Grand East and presented him with the Rev. John Beardsley Medallion on behalf of the Grand Lodge of New Brunswick. Most Worshipful Brother Moseley in reply expressed his appreciation for the distinction and honor conferred upon him.

Right Worshipful Brother Warren J. Maxwell, Past Junior Grand Warden was also conducted to the Grand East and presented with the Rev. John Beardsley Medallion in recognition of his outstanding contribution to the Craft generally in the jurisdiction of the Grand Lodge of New Brunswick. Right Worshipful Brother Maxwell addressed the Grand Lodge expressing his gratitude and appreciation for this honor.
